Our respite from any major external commitments was cut short by orders for the Bn. once more to enforce a Curfew and maintain Law and Order in the now all too familiar Manshiya area of Jaffa, which, in it's present general appearance, is reminiscent of London during the days of the Blitz. In compliance with the order the three Rifle Coys. "B", "C" and "D" supported by a Pln. of Carriers were to establish their "HQ" in the Jaffoon Cantonment under the command of Maj. O. A. J. Cary-Elwes.

On the 19th. Feb., the morning of our departure, the morale of the troops was as usual very high, though many must have wondered, as they sped Westwards along the Jerusalem-Jaffa road, which itself brought back many vivid memories of past patrols, escorts and road-blocks, and recalled an identical task of a month ago, what their reception might be and whether the Powers that be would grant them a safe and uneventful journey to their new location.
